

Bel Air Furniture Care & Cleaning Instructions

Care of upholstery – furniture fabric of bar stools, booths, chairs & sofas

Bel Air upholstery is made from premium faux leather padding. Below you can find care and cleaning solutions.

Steps for everyday cleaning:

- 1. Use warm water, a gentle neutral household spray cleaner or mild soapy detergent solution with water, and a clean, nonabrasive cloth.
- 2. Clean the soiled area using a rotating motion.
- 3. Next, rinse off the detergent residue with clean warm water, using a clean, non-abrasive cotton cloth. Take care not to excessively soak the upholstery, especially near seams.
- 4. Dry the surface with a soft, clean, non-abrasive cotton cloth.

For tough stains: carefully and gently clean the affected area with a solution of 25% - 40% (max) ethanol solution. Sanitize with alcohol or 5% Lysol.

Stains caused by oil or ink must be removed immediately.

Avoid using bleach or products with bleach/chlorine, polishing paste, solvents, chloride, abrasives, chemical cleaning agents or wax polishes.

Avoid contact with excessive heat and any heating products.

Care of metal chrome parts – bar stools, chairs legs and table legs

For maintenance cleaning: occasionally polish with oil and wipe completely dry.

For tough stains: We advise using special detergents made for chromed products to clean the metal chromed parts of furniture. Important to follow the label instructions of the chrome specific cleaner.

Parts with powder coating finish: to be cleaned with a soft cloth and can be polished with soft oil. Dry immediately after cleaning and shine with a soft cloth.

Avoid using acetone, synthetic or other diluents, detergents containing chlorine or other oxidant material, which do not have the protective oil film.

Care of laminate - table tops

Bel Air tabletops are made from Formica High Pressure Laminate. Below you can find care and cleaning solutions.

Steps for everyday cleaning:

- Use a clean, damp, nonabrasive cotton cloth and a mild liquid detergent or household cleaner. Clean the soiled area using a rotating motion.
- 2. Next, rinse with clean water, using a clean, non-abrasive cotton cloth. Take care not to flood the laminate, especially near seams.
- 3. Dry the surface with a soft, clean, non-abrasive cotton cloth.

Avoid using abrasive pads, scouring powders, steel wool, sandpaper, abrasive cleaners, acidic or alkali based cleaners.

Steps to remove tough stains:

- 1. Apply a recommended cleanser and allow it to draw out the stain.
 - Acetone
 - Rubbing alcohol (isopropyl)
 - Ethanol
- 2. Clean using a rotating motion. If a cotton cloth or sponge doesn't do the trick, try using a nylon-bristle brush.
- 3. Rinse with water and dry the surface. Remember, it is important to remove all cleanser from the surface.

Additionally using baking soda to remove tough stains can be used with the following steps below:

- 1. Apply paste of baking soda and water
- 2. Wipe up the paste with damp non-abrasive cotton cloth
- 3. Rinse clean with water

Always follow cleaning or disinfectant with a warm water rinse and dry.
